160D Ordinance Updates.

Staff working through updating ordinance to include new references to NCGS 160D and to includes all new language that conflicts with our current ordinance. First round of amendments has been submitted to legal for review.

## Open Space/Parks and Recreation Requirements

Working on creating ordinance language that will increase open space requirements and tie to the Parks and Recreation and Greenway Master Plan. Will be presented to Town Council for on September 28, 2020.

### Silverline:

Proposed alignment options for the Silverline have been created and presented to staff for comment. The options will be presented to Town Council on August 10 for information purposes. Public meetings will be held in September to gather input and preferences. The selected alignment will be presented at a public meeting in December. CATS will be seeking a resolution of support from the Town early 2021.

## Idlewild and Stevens Mill Project:

A site plan for a grocery has been submitted for property near the corner of Idlewild and Stevens Mill Roads. Approval of this project will be administrative due to the use proposed is by-right and the site is less than 25 acres.

A separate Development Agreement application has been submitted for properties that appear to be outparcels for the grocery store.

Review for ordinance compliance is being completed and comments will be provided to the applicant.

# Other Highlights

- The police department continues to run at full operational readiness during the COVID pandemic and is in communications with Union and Mecklenburg County Emergency Operation Centers.
- One of our newest police officers, Nicholas Ivy-Brooks successfully completed field training and is in the solo patrol phase.
- The SPD is continuing the implementation of our new departmental policy manual.
- The SPD unwanted medication disposal unit was launched in September. In this month, the department collected 16 pounds of unwanted medication.
- Two officers utilized narcan on a possible drug overdose. Victim was transported to the hospital for further evaluation.
- While investigating a suspicious vehicle in a neighborhood an SPD officer located 1/4 pound of marijuana and other drugs and paraphernalia
- Officer Stephen Weeks received his General Certification from Criminal Justice Standards.

## **Public Works Update.**

- Cleaned gutters and trimmed limbs away from evidence building.
- Working on a project for PD to create a booking room in one of the interview rooms.

- Worked through some issues with the key fob system. It is working except for one door where the equipment took a lightening hit. Replacement has been ordered. Door still works in a secure manner.
- Had to remove/cleanup tree that fell during a storm in Independence Village.
- Repaired garbage disposal in PD.
- Replaced faded stop sign on Strawberry Rd. in Chestnut Oaks.
- Replaced/repaired stop sign and street sign Lakewood & Sweetbriar.
- Repaired street sign at Stallings Rd. & Stallings Commerce Dr.

## **Programs & Events**

Each Thursday in October, staff are hosting Captain Hook's Treasure Hunt in Stallings Park. We have been averaging about 40 participants each week.

Quad Creek Disc Golf Challenge – partnered with Union County and Indian Trail, we are a host site for a month-long disc golf challenge at 4 courses in Union County. Custom discs were distributed on the first day of the challenge.

Neighborhood Clean Up kit registration goes live this month. With the help of Code Enforcement Officer Kolleen Dickinson, each kit will have high-vis t-shirts, gloves, safety vests, litter bags, and water bottles for participants.

Christmas lights in the park will go on Nov 1 this year.

### • FY2020 CAFR

- Town submitted draft CAFR to Potter & Company last week and once financial statements are finalized, they will be merged into the report and submitted to the state.
- Expect to publish financials by Monday, October 26.

### Town Finances

- Ad Valorem Taxes are beginning to be collected for FY2021
  - Collections through 10/21/2020 are \$487,703
- Sales and Use Taxes for July and August
  - Town conservatively budged \$1,252,000 in sales and use tax revenue for FY2021
  - Collections for July and August (received in September and October) totaled \$266,860
  - At this collection rate, town is expected to exceed budget by approximately \$349,000

# **General Government/Town Clerk Update**

### **CARES Act**

O As you know, Stallings received \$223,851 from Union County the CARES Act from the federal government to assist with COVID-19 related expenses. Each month, Stallings reports eligible expenses to the County in order to receive these funds. So far, three reports have been submitted to the County totaling \$223,081.37 in requested reimbursement.

## **Surplus Sales**

o There have been no surplus sales in 2020. Staff hopes to begin scheduling the sale of surplus items due to renovations in the next month. The Police Department is also scheduled to trade-in three vehicles by the end of the calendar year at a combined value of \$4500.
